# Second Collection this Weekend Religious Retirement



In 1988, the bishops of the United States established the Retirement Fund for Religious collection to address this serious retirement funding need among U.S. religious orders. In 2022, the NRRO's annual collection raised \$27.6 million. Per the 2023 statistics collected by the NRRO, a mere 6% of religious communities that shared data with the NRRO reported having sufficient retirement funding. Since the fund's inception, U.S. Catholics have graciously contributed more than \$975 million, with almost \$842 million distributed to support the day-to-day care of thousands of elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. From 2009 onwards, the annual expenses of supporting senior women and men religious surpassed \$1 billion.

## Catholic Social Teaching on Migration and Refugees A Reflection from St. John's Social Justice Committee

Advent and Christmas is a time that turns our attention to the Holy Family's journey to Bethlehem and later flight to Egypt. In His life, Christ showed and taught that part of journeying with others includes welcoming the stranger.

Local parishes like ours are called to welcome the stranger and "not view the new arrivals as a threat to its cultural identity and well-being, but as an incentive to walk together with these new brothers and sisters who are themselves rich in particular gifts, in an ever-new process of forming a people capable of celebrating unity in diversity" (Refugees: A Challenge to Solidarity, 1992). You can join in this Catholic project of welcome by learning more through the resources below, or getting involved locally.

A special opportunity will include the Posadas with the local Mayan Catholic Community and St. John's Parish on Sunday, December 17, at 7pm in lower St. John's. Posadas ("shelter") remembers the journey of the Holy Family leading up to the Nativity as Mary and Joseph

sought shelter. This event will share Mayan culture, Q'anjob'al language, and fellowship as we seek to journey in solidarity as a parish community. Please join us!

#### The Second Sunday of Advent

This is a great week indeed, on December 12<sup>th</sup> we celebrate our lady of Guadalupe and on December 16<sup>th</sup> we commemorate the beginning of Mary and Joseph's journey to find that special place to give birth to her son, Jesus.

When I was growing up this was a much anticipated week filled with excitement. Oh what a joy it was be to help my grandma decorate a shrine for our Lady, waiting until midnight to sing Las Mañanitas. Listening to the story every year of how Mary appeared to St. Juan Diego and understanding more fascinating details of the apparition every year.

Then on December 16th, my brother and I would try to behave all day so we could attend the *Posadas*, which consisted of recitation of the Holy Rosary, enacting the journey alongside Mary and Joseph, singing and begging for an inn, getting a favor bag filled with candy and fruit. And then doing it all over for the following eight days until December 24th when Joseph and Mary finally found a place.

When I arrived in the US, neither of these traditions were observed; our hurried lives didn't leave time for it. It was a big adjustment to make; I guess growing up helped too. All of that excitement that I felt as a kid is now caused by lighting the second candle on the Advent Wreath. And now that I'm an adult, I try to share all of that joy that with my kids and make them aware that no matter where we are, Advent gives us the opportunity to prepare our hearts and faithfully wait to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

Whatever your tradition is for this week, let us take a break from our busy schedules to see God at work in our lives and in our world. May God's spirit transform the days leading up to Christmas into a time of holy anticipation; preparing our hearts, as we faithfully await the chance to celebrate the arrival of our king.
