

# Second Collection December 9-10 Religious Retirement



In 1988, the bishops of the United States established the Retirement Fund for Religious collection to address this serious retirement funding need among U.S. religious orders. In 2022, the NRRO's annual collection raised \$27.6 million. Per the 2023 statistics collected by the NRRO, a mere 6% of religious communities that shared data with the NRRO reported having sufficient retirement funding. Since the fund's inception, U.S. Catholics have graciously contributed more than \$975 million, with almost \$842 million distributed to support the day-to-day care of thousands of elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. From 2009 onwards, the annual expenses of supporting senior women and men religious surpassed \$1 billion.

# WISDOM ON THE WAY

Welcome to the new Liturgical Year and to the season of Advent. Below are some elements of the Advent season, along with some explanations that can be of help as we enter into the season of patient waiting together. But first, this can also be a moment to offer gratitude to God for the blessings of the past Liturgical Year.

In Year A, we heard mostly from Matthew's gospel, which includes the Beatitudes, the Lord's Prayer, the wonderful parables of the Kingdom of God, and the Judgment of the Nations. As you know, I raise up frequently to our awareness that our ancestors in faith, who gifted us this space for worship, inscribed the first portion of each of the eight Beatitudes from Matthew's gospel in our stained glass above the sanctuary. These continue to guide our Christian lives, as they did for the disciples and Jesus' own time. I also want to offer gratitude for the music and liturgies of the past year—especially Holy Week!-which have nourished our faith. Special thanks to all our ministers for making St John's a place of growth in faith, hope and love!

I note three significant changes to the space as we begin Advent. The first is the liturgical color, which shifts to violet—or purple. The Catholic bishops note that Advent and Lent use this color since these seasons are meant to help us prepare for great feast days. Advent includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

Next, the arrangement of the space is simpler than at other times of year. This is done to help us wait patiently for the coming of the Lord. And we can also keep in mind that the Advent theme of waiting is twofold-we wait for the joyful celebration of Christmas, and we wait in joyful hope for the second coming of the Lord.

Finally, the light of the Advent wreath, which begins this weekend with one small light, gradually grows until the arrival of the Christ-light, who comes to scatter the darkness like the rising of the sun. Many Christians use this symbol in the home during Advent and offer a prayer as the candles are lit. Our special companions during Advent are John the Baptist, Mary and Isaiah. John features prominently the Second and Third Sundays of Advent, while certain readings from the Prophet Isaiah are meant to confirm that Jesus is the Messiah prophesied in the Hebrew Scriptures. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, and the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe also serve as interludes as we journey with her and Joseph to Bethlehem for the birth of her child, Jesus, Immanuel, God-with-us.

Before I close, I also encourage you to consider planning a spiritual retreat in 2024. There are many options in the spring, summer and fall. Keep in mind our own Spiritual Exercises in Daily Life opportunities that are ongoing. See Fr. Matt or Sara for more information on these opportunities.

Thus, we commence Advent in joyful anticipation of the coming of the Lord!
